



Mike Rogers served as an Officer in the U.S. Army before he joined the FBI as a Special Agent in Chicago where he was tasked with tackling organized crime. In 1994, Mike was elected to the Michigan Senate where he represented his hometown, and quickly rose to leadership, helping pass bills that lowered education and healthcare costs for families. In 2000, Mike was elected to the U.S. House, defeating his opponent in the closest election in the country. Following his time in Congress, Mike founded cyber security companies where he advised large and small businesses on best practices to protect their data against foreign bad actors like China, Iran, and Russia.
